PUBLIC HEALTH

HIA secured the introduction of bipartisan legislation, the Health Data Use and Privacy Commission Act, to produce actionable recommendations to address the growing patchwork of state laws and federal enforcement that is complicating how health information is used.

TELEHEALTH

As leading telehealth advocates for more than a decade, HIA continues to lead the charge on key policy changes to pass legislation permanently expanding access to telehealth for Medicare beneficiaries and in private markets.

HIA successfully advocated for a two-year extension of Medicare telehealth flexibilities.
